

INFORMATION MEMORANDUM JUDICIAL SALE OF M/Y QUEEN ANNE IMO 9704958 BY SEALED BID AUCTION FEBRUARY 17, 2022



BACKGROUND OF THE YACHT

Motoryacht Queen Anne has been seized (by judicial arrest) by the United States of America and is presently in the possession of the United States Marshals Service ("USMS"), in connection with a case in United States District Court for the District of Utah, Case 2:21-cr-00140-JNP ("The Court").

On September 13, 2021, the United States of America filed a motion with The Court requesting an interlocutory sale of M/Y Queen Anne, which was granted by the Court on October 22, 2021.

On November 22, 2021, the United States Marshals granted custodianship of the yacht to National Maritime Services, Inc. of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, USA ("National"), in connection National's approved plan to market the yacht in a joint venture with Fraser Yachts Florida Inc.

VIEWING PROCEDURES

Queen Anne is available for visual inspections in Limassol, Cyprus. Interested parties are encouraged to view the yacht prior to submitting a bid at auction.

Viewings must be arranged in advance by contacting National Maritime Services, Inc., Bob Toney, +1(954)647-7194, GRToney@NatMars.com.

Viewings will include touring the yacht, making visual inspections of open areas, and operating the main engines and generators. Sea trials are not permitted.

Visitors must be escorted at all times. The maximum number of onboard visitors is limited to 3 persons at any time, during daylight hours only.

Each visitor is required to deliver the following items in advance:

- Full name and passport copies
- Completed Visitor Waiver and Acknowledgement

AUCTION DETAILS, BID PROCESS & PAYMENT REQUIREMENTS

Queen Anne will be sold by sealed bid auction to the highest bidder meeting the criteria contained herein

Tie bids (same amount) will be requested to provide best & final offers

The yacht will be sold "as is, where is" in its current berth at Limassol, Cyprus

Offshore closing is permitted in accordance with the terms of the Purchase and Sale Agreement The auction will be conducted in US dollars

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The minimum required bid is US \$5,500,000

The United States Marshals Service will receive all bids by direct email to a secure mailbox and will confirm receipt by email

Tendered bid details will not be shared with third parties until after the auction closes

There is no fee to place a bid

A US \$500,000 escrowed deposit is required prior to bid submission, to be received no later than February 15, 2022

National will confirm receipt of all bid deposits by email

The auction will close February 17, 2021, 4PM Eastern Standard Time

On or before February 23, 2022, the first-highest bidder will be notified of their successful bid Deposits will be refunded to unsuccessful bidders no later than March 25, 2022

To submit an official binding bid, each registered party will be required to deliver the following:

- US \$500,000 bid deposit, confirmed receipt no later than February 15, 2022
- Bid form with preassigned bidder code delivered directly to United States Marshals Service
- Bid amount equal to or exceeding the minimum bid requirement (US \$5,500,000)
- Purchase and Sale Agreement pre-signed by bidder

The USMS will select the winning bidder and notify them by signing the Purchase and Sale Agreement and sending the successful bidder a copy.

Upon receipt of a successful bid notification, the successful bidder shall:

- Endeavor to affect the sale in accordance with the Purchase and Sale Agreement
- Within 10 business days, deliver the unpaid purchase price (the successful bid amount less bid deposit) by wire transfer to designated account. Failure to remit the unpaid purchase price, in accordance with the timing described herein, will result in forfeiture of successful bidder's escrowed bid deposit.
- Within 30 calendar days, close sale and take delivery of the yacht

If the first notified successful bidder fails to deliver the unpaid purchase price within the required timeframe above, at seller's option, the second-highest bidder may be notified and become the new successful bidder. Thereafter, the new successful bidder will be bound to the above-described payment and closing requirements.

Thereafter, if the second-highest bidder fails to remit the unpaid purchase price within the required timeframe above, at seller's option, the third-highest bidder will be notified and become the successful bidder. Thereafter, the new successful bidder will be bound to the above-described payment and closing requirements.
